Course Description: Course is designed to meet the individual reading needs and learning styles of students interested in studying the correlation of literature to film. The course is based on films that have been inspired by great literary works. Students will be assessed on their comparative knowledge of the literary work to the film translation. This course also offers the opportunity for students to understand how movies are inspired by great literature and allows them to choose novels that have been specifically adapted for the screen. There is one required novel within this course, failure to read this novel will result in a lower grade, and possibly a failing grade. For a higher academic level of achievement students may select one additional novel of choice for extra credit from the reading list posted at the website. Students are encouraged to purchase the novel so they may highlight and make reference notes in the literature they are studying. Parents should make themselves aware of the course reading list. **For this class, the Adams County Five Star School Board of Education has provided a waiver from board policy regarding the viewing of R-rated films. The district requires parental/guardian signature and approval before your son/daughter can participate in viewing the in-class selections, in accordance with Superintendent Policy/Procedure Code: 6144.1.**

State/District Standards Students will acquire: understanding of history, vocabulary, and media's affects on society, appreciation for the artistic and technical aspects behind the median and an ability to respect representational themes and opinions. Students will understand: A variety of literary genre in connection to American cinematography. Standard 1: Oral Expression and Listening: Students will use speaking skills to deliver information and practice listening skills to determine validity, accuracy and relevance of information received. Standard 2: Reading for all purposes: Students will demonstrate mastery of reading skills with fiction, non-fiction, poetic and dramatic texts. Standard 3: Writing and Composition: Students will demonstrate mastery of writing skills by creating a variety of written works including fiction, persuasive, informational, expository and analytical. Standard 4: Research and Reasoning: Students will demonstrate mastery of a variety of research and reasoning skills to create written and oral presentations of information as well as demonstrating understanding of ethical uses of information and analysis of bias and relevance of information found. Attendance: Tardiness and absences have negative impacts on students' progress. Grading: Assessments and grading standards are applied consistently to students of similarly demonstrated ability. Assessments are based solely on demonstrated student progress and achievement of reasonable and clear standards. Students are encouraged to turn in all assignments. Group projects: Students will be graded both overall as a group and individually.

Grading Scale: Per district policy: A= 100-90, B=89-80, C=79-70, D=69-60, F= 59- below. **Assignment Weights:** Film Assignments @ 75% and Literature Assignments @ 25%. **Make-up Assignments and Late Work:** Per the Horizon High School policy and district policy.

Classroom Expectations Student's will complete online testing for this course outside of the classroom period. As this is an English literature course, additional reading time will be required. Students should be aware of the vital importance attendance makes, as DVD's and lectures performed in class are a one chance opportunity and may not be available outside of this course. Quizzes and written student responses are a weekly occurrence. Extra Credit is available, but none will be accepted the last week of the quarter.
