Topic	Stop Motion Animation

Objective	Making use of a digital camera to create a stop motion animation video by giving life to an inanimate object.
Directions	<p>You can do this process by pressing record and then pause on the digital camera. Make sure that you use a tripod or some type of mounting bracket in order to record without additional movement. The camera must not move between shots (pressing record and pause) but your object must be moved between these actions. The end result is when you play your video, you tell a story with your inanimate object. Think of a tennis ball moving towards some sort of goal. Or a pencil trying to escape being sharpened.</p> <p>Warning: this process is very time consuming. Some examples of movies that have made use of this process include: <i>The Nightmare Before Christmas</i> (1993), <i>Rudolf the Red Nose Reindeer</i> (1964), <i>Corpse Bride</i> (2005), and <i>King Kong</i> (1933).</p>
